Remit:

The Theatres Trust is the National Advisory Body for Theatres and was established by The Theatres Trust Act 1976 'to promote the better protection of theatres'. The Trust is a statutory consultee in the planning system and local planning authorities in Wales are required to consult the Trust on planning applications for 'development involving any land on which there is a theatre', 'residential development within 50 metres of a theatre' as well as for proposed theatres. The definition of theatres within the Act defines a theatre as 'any building or part of a building constructed wholly or mainly for the public performance of plays', and therefore applies to theatres, playhouses, arts centres, ciné-varieties or buildings converted for theatre use, old and new, in other uses or disused.

Comment:

This application has come to the attention of Theatres Trust because it is seeking to restore and return to use Thespian House, which forms a part of Theatre Royal. The building would be used as a yoga studio and cafe.

Theatre Royal opened in 1894, designed in a neo-classical style with imposing rendered brick frontage with a prominent 'Theatre Royal' inscription. It was wellequipped and capable of receiving the largest of touring shows. Thespian House was a later addition constructed in the 1920s, possibly to provide accommodation for touring artists, and probably completed to coincide with significant internal alterations within the theatre. Originally Thespian House featured a crenellated parapet but alterations over time have reduced its decorative significance. Theatre Royal is considered an excellent example of its type, but after a significant period of vacancy following its closure as a bingo hall in 2006 it is in a poor and deteriorating condition.

On that basis we are supportive of these plans to bring Thespian House back to positive use. Potentially this could be a catalyst for restoration or re-use of the main theatre building which we are keen to see, and these plans would not compromise such efforts. The refurbishment of Thespian House is itself a heritage benefit and will help conserve this building as a reminder of Theatre Royal's theatrical past.

We therefore support the granting of listed building consent.
